



Let's go racing the HRSA way.

You have a car? You would like to enter MSA/HRSA sanctioned events? Before you can do so, there are a few things you need to know and do.

Where to now?

1. You need to join HRSA. Go to www.historicracing.co.za/members and create a profile so you can log in to the membership portal. Membership costs R700.00 per annum and runs from 1 January 2019 to 31 December 2019.
2. Download the specific category Sporting and Technical rules from www.historicracing.co.za/downloads then navigate to "Year regulations" and select the category you intend to enter. Important to make sure your car is eligible, before you start building/preparing the car and the modifications you intend to make are allowed.
3. Apply for a race number. You will find all the race numbers listed on the web site at www.historicracing.co.za/race-numbers. A number is allocated and is reserved across all categories of HRSA. Let me have the number you would like, and I will get it approved by the Exco.
4. Category sponsor decals. It is compulsory for category sponsor decals to be displayed on the front windscreen of the car. Decals may be purchased from the HRSA club secretary.
5. You will need to download and complete a Historic Technical Passport (HTP) at www.historicracing.co.za/downloads then navigate to "Other forms". Your car will have to be presented to the category Technical consultant for inspection, authorising and submission to MSA for allocation of an HTP number. If the car inspection is not done on an official HRSA registration day there will be a charge of R300.00 for the TC to inspect the car. The HTP stays with the car and must be presented at every race meeting along with the scrutineering record. Although roll cages are not compulsory for Fine cars it is advisable for you to at least put in a roll over bar. If not, it is compulsory to complete a Roll Cage indemnity which can be downloaded from "Other Forms" section of www.historicracing.co.za/downloads.
6. Complete the HRSA Provenance document. This document provides information about the car you race. Specifications, cost to build, achievements etc. This is for the spectators benefit and should be displayed on the windscreen of the car between races.
7. You will need to apply for a competition licence. Go to <https://www.msaonline.co.za/> and create a profile then follow the steps to apply for a licence. You will need a circuit racing club licence and mandatory insurance.
8. Familiarise yourself with the MSA GCR and SSR, commonly known as the "White Book", which deals with the all aspects of the sport. It can be downloaded from <http://www.motorsport.co.za/DisplayLink.aspx?group=Publications&name=Publications>. You will find information about roll cages in these regulations. It is your responsibility to know the rules. Ignorance is no excuse.
9. Finally, send your full contact details and you will be added to our WhatsApp group and email list.
10. Download the racing calendar from www.historicracing.co.za/calendar/, and diarise these dates, they are not negotiable. All other conflicting events must be cancelled to accommodate racing ☺.
